




OPERATIONAL STRUCTURE





ORGANOGRAM OF DENTAL HOSPITAL








FIRST YEAR BDS ACADEMICS



During the session 2019 to 2020, total number of lectures are delivered in following ratio by four departments. Most of the lectures were delivered online due to the Covid-19 pandemic.




Graph 1: Overall Total Number of Lectures Delivered by Each Department During the Session 2019-2020.






Graph 2: Practical Record of Online and On Campus Practical's of the Anatomy and Physiology






SECOND YEAR BDS ACADEMICS




Graph 4: Overall Total Number of Lectures Delivered by Each Department During the Session 2019-2020.






Graph 5: Total Number of Lectures Delivered in Campus and Delivered Online During Covid-19 During Session 2019-2020 By Each Department.


Graph 6: Overall Number of Practical Conducted During the 2nd Year BDS Session 2019-2020






Graph 7: Total Number of Practical Conducted by Each Department Online and Online


Graph 8: Total Overall Number of Assessments Conducted by Every Department





Graph 9: Total Number of Assessments Conducted Online and On-Campus During Covid-19 During the Session Of 2019-2020.










THIRD YEAR BDS -ACADEMICS



Graph: 10 Total Number of Lectures and Tutorials Conducted for BDS 3rd Year Session 2019-2020.



Graph: 11 Total Number of Clinical Sessions and Practical's Conducted for BDS 3rd Year Session








FINAL YEAR BDS -ACADEMICS






Graph 13: Total no. of lectures delivered by each department during session 2019 – 2020






Graph 15: Overall Total No. Of Clinical Sessions Conducted By Every Department During Session 2019-2020






Graph 16: Total No. Of Clinical Sessions Conducted In Campus & Online During Covid – 19 During Session 2019 – 2020 By Every Department.


Graph 17: Overall Total No. Of Assessments Conducted By Every Final Year BDS Department





Graph 18: Total of no. of assessments, conducted in-campus & online during Covid - 19 during session 2019-2020 by every department





AKHTER SAEED DENTAL CLINICS – BAHRIA TOWN





Graph: 20 Total Number of Patients Treated at West Wood Branch of Farooq Hospital










FAROOO HOSPITAL WESTWOOD BRANCH - MAXILLOFACIAL CENTER


Oral and Maxillofacial Centre was established in Farooq Hospital Westwood Branch has been serving the community since 2017. It has been built with the objectives to fulfill the requirement of a state of an art Oral and Maxillofacial trauma centre within the vicinity. Our experienced Maxillofacial surgeons have been working tirelessly since its foundation. This centre also trains the undergraduate students who under the supervision of worthy supervisors acquire the required skills and knowledge. The department has following objectives:

- 1. Outpatient oral and maxillofacial surgery procedures including management of simple and surgical extractions and impacted teeth.
- 2. Management of patients under general anesthesia using inhalation anesthesia
- 3. Managing patient airway under general anesthesia
- 4. To diagnose, stage, and provide treatment for malignant head and neck tumors
- 5. Operative management of head and neck tumors including oral cancer and salivary gland disease
- **6.** Management of the multi-system trauma patient at a Level I Trauma center
- **7.** Management of wound care and wound healing.



Graph 21: Total Number of Oral and Maxillofacial Procedures Performed at Farooq Dental Hospital








FAROOQ HOSPITAL DENTAL CLINICS EME BRANCH



The year 2019-2020 has been a very busy year for the AMDC Community Outreach Program and we have continued to grow by expanding our services in the areas we serve. • To act as a primary health care provider for individuals and group of patients. This includes emergency and multidisciplinary comprehensive oral health care, directing health promotion and disease prevention activities and using advanced treatment modalities.










Graph 24: The Chart Shows the Average Number of Village Patients That Were Provided with Dental

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CLINICO-PROFESSIONAL CONFERENCE

Medical conferences are incredibly useful for any medical professional. They offer invaluable time to speak with fellow practitioners, as well as showing you new innovations in your field. You will be able to both receive and give advice on your chosen area of expertise.

Clinico-professional conference has been implemented in Akhter Saeed Dental College since **2016.** The Clinico-professional conference is conducted twice in a month (Friday). All the faculty members and house officers use to participate in this activity. This activity is completely for demonstrators to enhance their teaching skills.











CLINICO-PATHOLOGICAL CONFERENCE

Clinico-Pathological Conference (CPC) is a great educational tool as it gives the students an opportunity to review and debate among themselves the differential diagnosis, prognosis and treatment of a patient as described in a case presentation.

After the induction of house officers of our pioneer batch in **2019** Akhter Saeed Medical and Dental college have been practicing these clinic pathological conferences twice a month. The CPC is presented by the House officers and supervised by the respective head of department in which every department present their cases. The process involves case presentation, diagnostic data, discussion of differential diagnosis, logically narrowing the list to few selected probable diagnoses and eventually reaching a final diagnosis and its brief discussion. The presenter at the final session of CPC discusses how the diagnosis is confirmed and also provides details regarding the case outcome.







INFECTION CONTROL AND PREVENTION WORKSHOPS

According to **World Health Organization** infection prevention and control is a scientific approach and practical solution designed to prevent harm caused by infection to patients and health workers. This approach is grounded in infectious diseases, epidemiology, social science and health system strengthening. IPC occupies a unique position in the field of patient's safety, quality and universal health coverage. The dental college **infection and prevention control** committee was constituted in 2018 which is headed by **Dr. Ali Raza**

Infection, prevention and control (IPC) is a practical evidence-based approach which prevents health care workers and patients from being harmed by avoidable infection.

AMDC organized the hands-on training workshop dated *15 September 2020* to familiarize the faculty members and the paramedical staff on how to protect the patient and health care personnel from infection. There were *15 faculty members* who participated in this workshop which consisted of 2 components

- Lecture/hands on training
- Mock exam and assessment followed by UHS accredited certification.
- Infection control team guided about the standard precautions like hand hygiene, use of PPE, respiratory hygiene/cough etiquette, sharp safety, safe injection practices and sterilization of instruments.





COVID-19 SYMPOSIUM

Coronavirus disease 2019 was declared a pandemic by the world health organization in early March 2020. Globally extraordinary measures are being adopted to combat the formidable spread of the ongoing outrate under such conditions people's adherence to preventive measures is greatly affected by their awareness of disease. There is an urgent need of regular educational interventions and training programmes on COVID-19 infection control practices among health care workers. The importance of such trainings is to decrease the risk of transmission of infection to health care workers and dental students as well as provide optimal health care services to the patients.

For this the Covid-19 surveillance committee has been constituted in **2020**. The committee is headed by **Prof. Col. Dr. Iffat Batool.** The first COVID-19 symposium was conducted on **28**th **September 2020** on "COVID-19 AWARENESS and SOP'S". The symposium was conducted by **Prof. Col. Dr. Iffat Batool** in which she addressed the AMDC dental faculty about the COVID-19 history, its route of transmission and how to prevent this by following SOP's.









WASTE MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP


FACULTY RE-CREATIONAL TRIPS 2020


